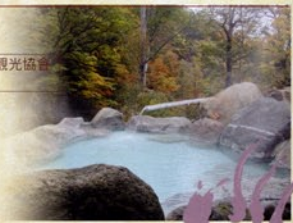

Nikko

Nikko's main attractions are the Oku-Nikko Wetlands and Kegon Waterfall, one of the three most famous waterfalls in Japan.



中禅寺湖
Lake Chuzenji
F 2 3

Located at 1,269 meters above sea level, the lake is the highest in Japan.



湯滝
Yutaki Waterfall E 2
A 70-meter-high waterfall spilling from Lake Yunoko.



竜頭ノ滝
Ryuzu Waterfall F 2
The water here falls from a height of 210 meters onto volcanic rock.

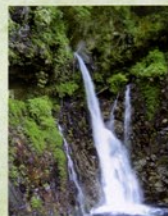
Kirifuri Highlands Kisuge-daira E 4

In the highlands, several tens of thousands of Nikko Kisuge (Hemerocallis middendorffii var. esculenta) blossom in early summer.



華嚴ノ滝
Kegon Waterfall F 3

The waterfall is 97 meters high and is another of the three most famous waterfalls in Japan.



裏見ノ滝
Urami Waterfall F 4

At 19 meters high, this is one of the three most famous waterfalls in Nikko.



霧降ノ滝
Kirifuri Waterfall F 4

Another of the three most famous waterfalls in Nikko, 75 meters high.

湯ノ湖
Lake Yunoko
E 2

The lake, which has a circumference of approximately 3 km, was created by the eruption of Mt. Mtsudake.



湯川
Yukawa River
E 2

The river runs through the Yutaki Waterfall and flows into Lake Chuzenji.



戦場ヶ原
Senjogahara Moor
F 2

The moor was created by the eruption of Mt. Nantai. Various alpine plants can be seen in this area.



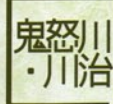
小田代ヶ原 Odashirogahara Moor F 2

F 4

A small valley through which the Daiya River runs.

An exciting river-rafting style experience through the valley.

Kinugawa, Kawaji

Dramatic natural surroundings and hot springs can be enjoyed in this area. There are also many leisure facilities catering for tourists.



Yunishikawa, Kawamata, Oku-Kinu

The innermost areas of Nikko. Outdoor leisure pursuits such as trekking and trolling can be enjoyed.



瀬戸台峽
Setoai Canyon
D 3

Stunning vistas of this 2 km-long canyon can be viewed from an observation deck and suspension bridge.



Imaichi

Located in the highlands at an altitude of 1,200 meters, this area is abundant with nature and boasts a picturesque landscape of pastures and various other seasonal attractions throughout the year.



Ashio

This area is surrounded by mountains on all sides. Some rare animals and plants including Japanese serows and Koshinsou (Pinguicula ramosa Miyoshi ex Yatabe) can be seen here.

You can enjoy the natural landscape as the train runs alongside the Watarase River.

備前鑛山
Mt. Bizen-Tateyama H 2

The Ashio Copper Mine was discovered in this mountain.



ニホンカモシカ
Japanese serow

This animal is designated a national natural treasure in Japan.



庚申山
Mt. Koshin G 1

Unusual rock formations and ancient forests can be found on this mountain.



虹見滝
Nijimi Waterfall D 6

Rainbows are created here as the sun hits the falling water.

龍王峽
Ryuokyo D 6

A picturesque spot where unusual rock formations can be seen.



鬼怒沼
Kinu-numa Wetland D 1

At an altitude of 2,040 meters, this is the largest highland marsh in Japan. As many as 48 large and small ponds are to be found within its boundaries.



間欠泉
Geyser D 2

The geyser here shoots hot water into the air every 40 to 50 minutes.



川俣湖
Lake Kawamata D 3

A beautiful lake in which boat trips and fishing can be enjoyed.

六方沢
Roppozawa E 4

Spectacular views can be seen from the 290-meter-long Roppozawa Bridge.

大笹牧場
Oosasa Pasture E 4

The pasture has a total area of 362 hectares, and is one of the largest pasture areas in Japan.



松本溪谷
Matsuki Valley G 2

The valley is also known as the Japanese Grand Canyon.



コウシンソウ
Koshinsou

The flower is designated a Special National Treasure.



History

The city boasts many world heritage shrines and temples where you can feel the history.

男体山

ML Nantai F 3

The mountain itself has always been worshipped. The inner sanctuary of the Nikko Futarasan Shinto Shrine is situated at the top of the mountain.



日光東照宮陽明門
Nikko Toshogu Yomeimon
F 4

The shrine holds the remains of Ieyasu Tokugawa, the first shogun of the Edo Shogunate. A magnificent, brilliantly-colored gate can be seen at the shrine. Tel.0288-54-0560 (Toshogu)

日光山輪王寺三仏堂
Nikkosan Rinnoji Temple
Sanbutsudo F 4

The Sanbutsudo Hall enshrines the Buddhas of the three mountains in Nikko. The three Buddhas are said to be the largest statues in Japan. Tel.0288-54-0531 (Rinnoji)

日光山輪王寺大猷院
Nikkosan Rinnoji Temple
Taiyu-in F 4

The soul of Iemitsu Tokugawa, the third shogun of Edo, is enshrined in the main hall. Tel.0288-54-0531 (Rinnoji)

A Buddhist monk who founded the Nikkosan temples.

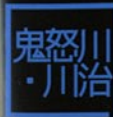
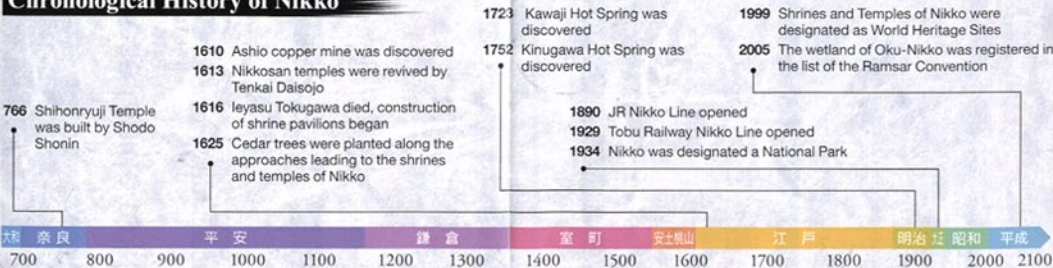


Tenkai Daisojo
A monk who is said to have contributed to the revival of Nikko.



Taisuke Itagaki
A politician who is said to have protected Nikko from war.

Chronological History of Nikko



Kinugawa, Kawaji

A hot spring (onsen) area with 300 years of history. As one of Japan's most famous hot spring resorts, the area has always been adored by visitors.

An old image of Kinugawa hot spring town E 6

Kinugawa Hot Spring was once called Taki Onsen (Waterfall hot springs). In the past, it was frequented by the local Daimyo (feudal lords) and monks.



昔の川治温泉街(現在の栗駒の湯周辺)
An old image of Kawaji Hot Spring - Yakushi-no-Yu D 6

These hot springs were discovered in the Edo period. They have been favored by locals and visitors seeking the therapy of a hot spring.



Yunishikawa, Kawamata, Oku-Kinu

Many historical sites associated with the Heike clan remain in these areas. Some little-known hot springs can also be found.

Imaichi

This area was an inn town in the past. The Cedar Avenue of Nikko has 390 years of history and has provided visitors with outstanding views.



報徳二宮神社
Hotoku Ninomiya Shrine G 5

This shrine is dedicated to the soul of Sontoku Ninomiya.



瀧尾神社
Takino Shrine F 5

This shrine was built almost 1200 years ago. It is famous as a shrine to the god of marriage.



Ashio

A copper mine was discovered here 400 years ago. This city once flourished as the largest copper producer in Japan.



庚申山猿田彦神社
Koshinsan Sarutahiko Shrine H 2

This shrine was built 1200 years ago by Shodo Shonin, who also founded Nikko. Tel.0288-93-3500

Remains of Ashio Copper Smelter G 2

Remains of the forge in which copper from the Ashio Copper Mine was smelted.



平家塚
Heike-zuka C 4

A burial mound that enshrines the souls of the defeated Heike warriors.

日光杉並木街道
Cedar Avenue of Nikko F 5 G 5 G 6

The Nikko avenue, which runs 37 km, is lined with approximately 13,000 cedar trees.



追分地藏尊
Oiwake jizo statues G 5

These statues are situated at the fork of the Nikko Kaido and Reiheishi Kaido roads.
